POLICE REPORT

Vehicle Collisions

There were 6 reported collisions in July. The first occurred at the intersection of Virgil Drive and Business 30 when a vehicle failed to yield from the stop sign on Virgil Drive and collided with a vehicle travelling east on Business 30. Damage was estimated at \$7,000 and no injuries were reported. The second collision occurred at the Commons Circle at Cornell College. This collision occurred when a driver attempted to exit his vehicle and the vehicle rolled forward, colliding with a parked vehicle, and knocking the driver down, resulting in minor injuries. Damage was estimated at approximately \$5,500. The third collision occurred at A Ave & 2nd Street SE when a child on a bicycle failed to yield to a stop sign and was struck by a vehicle travelling south on A Avenue, resulting in non-life threatening injuries. The child was transported to the hospital by ambulance. Damage was estimated at \$2,500. The fourth collision occurred at the Business 30 and Hwy 1 roundabout. The collision occurred when a semi and a vehicle were both travelling north on Hwy 1 and came to the roundabout. The semi was in the outside lane and the other vehicle was in the right lane. As the semi proceeded into the traffic circle the driver failed to ensure his vehicle remained within its lane of traffic, causing the trailer to sideswipe the passenger vehicle while it was at the yield sign. Damage was estimated at \$7,000 and no injuries were reported. The fifth collision occurred in the 700 blk of 2nd St NW when a vehicle backing out of their driveway collided with a parked legally parked vehicle. Damage was estimated at \$4,250 and no injuries were reported. The sixth collision occurred at 1st Street and 2nd Ave NW when a driver was attempting to park in the 100 block of 1st Street NW near the Lincoln Winebar. While attempting to park the driver pushed the accelerator instead of the brake, causing the vehicle to drive over the sidewalk, enter 2nd Ave, colliding with a parked vehicle, then continue west onto 2nd Ave colliding with the building at 201 1st St NW. Damage was estimated at \$21,500 and the driver was transported to the hospital for minor injuries.

Incidents/Arrest

There were 21 reported incidents in July. Reports included: Assault on Police Officer, Sexual abuse, OWI (x3), burglary, criminal mischief (x2), Assault Causing Injury-Domestic Abuse (x2), abandoned vehicle-tow (x2), driving while license suspended/revoked (x4), trespass warning-suspicious behavior, vehicle theft, Mental health assistance, violation of no contact order, and harassment.

There were 7 arrests reported in July. Arrest include: OWI (x3), driving while suspended/revoked/barred (x1), assault causing injury-DA (x2), and assault on police officer.



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K-9 Report

Monster had 3 deployments in July with 1 K9 Alert.

Community Service/Training/Misc.:

- Chief Shannon and Officer Gehrke met with MVCSD Administration to discuss School Resource Officer needs in a COVID learning environment.
- Continued to meet with City Admin, MVCSD, and Cornell Admin related to COVID response
- Met with GTSB Program Coordinator regarding our STEP contract.

GTSB:

During July 2020 Officers participated in the July 4th STEP wave and conducted 29 hours of STEP for the month. This enforcement resulted in 1 OWI arrest, 4 OWI contacts, a suspended/revoked driver, 25 speed violations, 1 stop sign violation, 3 registration violations, 1 insurance violation, 2 equipment violations, 3 other traffic violations, and 1 motorist assist. STEP activity was reported to the public during the monthly police report.

LISBON (28E Contracted Services):

Per the 28E agreement our department provided the following police services to Lisbon in June 2020:

- Patrol: 3,810 minutes
- Calls for service: 610 minutes (22 calls for service)
- Administrative Time: 410 minutes

Total time for July 2020: 4,830 minutes = 80.5 hrs. x \$40/hr. = Total: \$3,220.00.
